## Asheville Spring Warmup COVID-19 Safety Procedures/Protocols V2.0

- Masks or cloth face coverings must be worn properly (always covering nose and mouth) anywhere on the show grounds including the barns, common areas, on motorized vehicles, and in the warmup and show arena (when inside the show arena, masks or face coverings are always required. This includes when entering/exiting, on the concourse, seated in the stands/bleachers/at a table, and in the restrooms. Individuals failing to comply with this expectation will be asked to leave to show arena immediately and may not be permitted back in.
  - o Individuals are not required to wear a mask or face covering when mounted on a horse or in a carriage/cart.
  - To eat or drink, an individual must move far enough away from others to minimize the possibility of being within six feet of
    any other individual before the lowering the mask or face covering to eat or drink. The mask must be immediately replaced
    over the nose and mouth when finished.
- All individuals must always practice social distancing while on the competition grounds by staying at least 6 feet from any person who is not a member of their immediate household (individuals consistently living in the same house or dwelling).
  - o Members of the same household are always still required to wear masks or face coverings while anywhere on competition grounds and in the show arena.
  - o Individuals can be seated together while being transported by golf cart (or similar four-wheeled transport vehicle), but capacity may not exceed the number of seats on the cart or vehicle and all individuals must wear face masks or face coverings.
  - Congregating on or around a parked or stationary golf cart or vehicle is prohibited, unless the individuals are all visually identifiable (e.g., credentialed) as immediate household members, are all wearing face masks/face coverings, and do not exceed the seating capacity of the cart or vehicle.
- No more than 2 people will be allowed in the Show Office at one time.
- Anyone on the competition grounds must complete a waiver form and agree to have your temperature screened at check-in and daily throughout the show by Show Safety Personnel.
- An armband is required for admittance into the arena and must always be worn on the competition grounds.
- Participants and support personnel entering the competition grounds are required to self-monitor their temperature at least once <u>daily</u> prior to entering the competition grounds.
  - o Anyone with a temperature of 100.4° F or higher may not enter the show grounds and must notify show management.
- The following individuals are not allowed to enter the competition grounds:
  - o Anyone who exhibits COVID-19 symptoms.
  - o Anyone who has tested positive within the last 10 days.
  - Anyone who has tested positive outside of the past 10 days but is still symptomatic.
  - \* Anyone who has been exposed to or has been in close contact with someone who has symptoms or has tested positive withing either the last 7 or 10 days.
    - \* Exception: Healthcare personnel who have treated patients using appropriate medical-grade PPE during performing professional duties and those individuals who are fully vaccinated are exempted from this restriction.
      - Fully Vaccinated an individual is considered to be fully vaccinated two weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series (Pfizer, Moderna, etc.), or two weeks after a single-dose vaccine (Johnson & Johnson).
- If any person who was present on the competition grounds tests positive for COVID-19 within 14 days of the conclusion of competition the Competition Organizer must be notified immediately.
- No "general public and non-essential personnel" spectators will be allowed on the competition grounds.

Exhibitors, attendees, and staff must abide by these social-distancing and health protocols along with any others set by show management and local/state health authorities; failure to follow protocols could result in removal from the show grounds and the forfeiture of fees. Individuals will receive a warning for the first offense, mandatory discussion with show management for the second offense and potential removal from the facility for the third offense.
